Miso Ensemble (Portugal) bring their electroacoustic theatre/sound poetry to the UK in a performance of Miguel Azguime's O AR DO TEXTO OPERA A FORMA DO SOM INTERIOR [2001] (The Air of the text operates the form of the inner sound) for voice, flute and electronics.

Henri Chopin, a key figure from the French Avant-Garde and a celebrated sound poet, is responsible for pioneering work with tape recorders, studio technologies and the sounds and textures of the manipulated human voice. His stress on the corporeal aspect of sound is reminder that language stems as much from oral traditions as from classic literature.
